## SUBJECT: Florida Atlantic University Regulation on Institutes and Centers

### PROPOSED COMMITTEE

Board of Governors Regulation 10.015(3), University Policies for Institutes and Centers, states that the University Board of Trustees must adopt policies for establishing, operating, evaluating, reviewing and disbanding univer sity institutes and centers in accordance with Board of Governors criteria. Proposed Regulation 2.006 responds to this requirement and provides university guidelines for the establishment, operation, evaluation, review and dissolution of centers and institutes at Florida Atlantic University in conformity with the BOG regulation.

### IMPLEMENTATION PLAN /DATE Regulation 2.006 will be implemented upon approval of the Board of Trustees.



(4) Establishment of Institutes or Centers -

(a) To establish a State of Florida Institute or Center the provost of the host university shall prepare and submit a prop osal to the board of trustees of the host university for approval. Approved proposals shall be submitted to the Office of Academic and Student Affair s in the Board of Governors office.

1. The proposal shall specify thepurpose of the organization, the need and demand to be a State of Florida institute or center, consistency with the Board of Governors Strategic Plan, andfunding resources. The proposal shall also include a draft of the proposed Memorandum of Understanding, which has been ratified by the presidents of all affiliated institutions. The Memorandum of Understanding shall contain, at a minimum:

a. The name of the institute or center;

b. The identification of the host institution and participating institutions;

c. The mission of the institute or center;

d. Guidelines for appointing, fundi ng, supervising, and evaluating the director of the institute or center;

e. The criteria for appointments to the institute or center's advisory board, including terms, roles, authority, and, if known, current numbers;

f. Expectations for the administrative and logistical support for the institute or center, including expectations regarding the reimbursement to the host university for direct costs of administrative services rendered by the university to the institute or center;

g. Procedures at the institutional level for recommending increases/decreases in the appropriation of State funds for the institute or center;

h. Specifications for the processing of contracts and grants, including the percentage of overhead funds to be returned to the institute or center; and

i. Expectations and criteria for the cyclic review of the institute or center and other planning and expectations for its operation.

(b) After review by Board of Governor s staff the proposal will be forwarded to the Council of Academic Vice Presidents for approval and recommendation to the Chancellor. The Chancellor would then determine whether or not this proposal should be carried forward to the Board of Governors. Any institute or center must receive full approval from the Board of Governors prior to implementation to receive State of Florida status.

(c) University institutes and centers shall be established in accordance with university policy. A copy of an approv ed new university institute or center proposal containing basic descriptive, contact, and fiscal information shall be submitted to the Office of Academic and Student Affairs. # Regulation 2.006 Institutes and Centers

(1) PURPOSE. Florida Board of Governors (BOG) Regulation 10.01 Sets forth the criteria and guidelines for both State of Floridated state university Institutes and Centers. It requires each state university to deepe and publish clearly defined guidelines consistent with BOG policies for establing, operating, evaluating, reviewing and disbanding university institutes and centers is Tregulation responds to this requirement and provides university-wide guidelines for testablishment, operation, and review of university institutes and centers. This regulation is designed to facilitate the formation of new centers or institutes and to assist in thanagement and review of those existing. The Provost is hereby authorized to gramuthorization for the development and implementation of Florida Atlantic Universities institutes and centers. The "Exclusions" section of BOG Regulation 10.015 identifiesheet units that may beeferred to as "Institutes" or "Centers", whose purpose to provide services to the university community (for example, day care centers aching or learning centers, computer centers). Such units are not to be indexed "centers" for the purposes of this Regulation.

#### (2) DEFINITIONS.

A. An institute is an organized research, siee, and/or educational unit established on a continuing basis primarily, the coordination and promotion of interests organized around abd subject area. Normally, be breadth of projects and programs transcends department, school, collegee, en campus boundes. In general, an institute will have a much broader mission a wider set of goals and objectives than a center, and usually will involve a greatient erdisciplinary and inter-institutional involvement of faculty.

B. A center is analogous to an insttleubut is more limited in scope. A center is (i) an organized unit that serves a specific psepwithin an institute, or (ii) a unit that provides specialized capabilities to further ease, or enhance instruion or the delivery of services.

C. A University Institute or Center is an institute or center that has been formally recognized as a Florida Atlantic Uensity Institute or Creter pursuant to this regulation. It is important to distinguishbetween formally established institutes and centers and other units a less formal nature. In order request approval and formal designation as an institute orenter, a unit must have two or more members, one of whom must be a faculty member who is failty assigned to and compensated for work in the institute or center. A unit that has been approved to use the formal designation "institute" or "center" should notepresent itself as such.

D. A State of Florida Institute or Center is an entity with a statewide mission that may include two or more State unisities, established to coordinate interinstitutional research, service and teaching set the State University System. Those interested in State of Findra Institutes or Centers should be the BOG Regulation 10.015.

(3) GUIDELINES. Procedures for establissing, operating, evalution, reviewing, and disbanding University institutes and centers, in accordance with BOG criteria and this regulation, are recommended for review by three President for Research and approval by the Provost. They are published on the Division of Research web site. These guidelines pertain to both existing and three University institutes and centers.

- e. Budget reduction or expansion;
- f. Recommendations for change oclassification (State of Florida, Infrastructural, or University institute or center), if applicable; and
- g. Recommendations for status change (active, inactive, terminated), if applicable.

D. <u>Dissolution</u> Disbanding a University institute or center involves closing out the budget for the unit, transferring budgetets within the unit to the appropriate place(s), and disbursinegquipment and facilities as appriate. These tasks will be the responsibility of the Department Chair or appe as appropriate for the organization in question. The college or other unit within whithe institute or ceter is located must notify the Provost of the distation. The requirements in BOG Regulation 10.015(6) shall be followed, including notifying the Otte of Academic and Student Affairs in the BOG Office.

E. <u>Change of stat</u>usBOG Regulation 10.015 distiguishes between "State" institutes and centers and "University" institutes and centers. All institutes and centers at Florida Atlantic University shall first be teachished as "Universit" organizations. Their elevation to "State" status all be governed by procedurs secified by the BOG through Regulation 10.015 and other pairs able authorities.
