Regulation 4.013 Exceptional Circumstances Withdrawals

- (1) PurposeThepurpose of this regulation is to outline the psscend procedure for a student to request a withdrawal from the University for Exceptional Circumstances
- (2) The Exceptional Circumstances Withdrawal Commit(ECW) is comprised of the following persons:
 - (A) Associate Vice President (AVP) and ean of Students or designee (chairperson).
 - (B) Associate/Assistant Dean of Studefinom partner campuses or designee.
 - (C) Representative from Student Health Services
 - (D) Representative from Counseling Center
 - (E) Representative from the Office for Students with Disabilities
 - (F) Others campus administrators may be invited to participate at the invitation of the AVP and Dean of Students
- (3) Meetings will be held weekly or as neededminimum of three (3) committee members must be present to hold a meeting or take actibeECW committee will meet to discuss and take action on petitions. The petitioner may appear at the meeting only by invitation of the ECW committee.
- (4) Process and Procedure for an Exceptional Circumstances Withdrawal
 - (A) A student who finds it necessary worthdraw from the University for an exceptional circumstance after the official drop/and dcourses without consequences deadline must equest to do so in writing to the AVP and Dean of Studes tor Associate/Assistant Dean of Studes on the partner campuses
 - (B) Acceptable Reasons for Exceptional Circumstances Withdrawals
 - (i) Physicalillness or injuryor mental illness
 - (ii) Deathof an immediate familymember
 - (iii) Involuntary call to active military duty
 - (iv) Victim of a crime.

- (D) The application for Exceptional Circumstances Withdrawal must be filed with all documentation attached within the semester for which the withdrawal is requested Complete Applications received after the semester ends, but within six (6) months of obseurrence of one of the events listed under paragraph (4)(B) hereiny be considerent the AVP and Dean of Students' sole discretion if thestudent's documents demonstrate that it was not possible for the student to file in a timely manner for reasons outside of the student/strol.
- (E) All documentation must be in English or translated into English, and the translator's signature must be notarized. The translator must be someone other than the student or a relative of the student.
- (F) If the request for Exceptional Curmstances Withdrawal is granted, the student will receive a "WM" on his/her transcript, which indicates that the student withdrew from all of his/her classes because of Exceptional Circumstances."WM" notations do not affect the student's grade point average.
- (G) An Exceptional Circumstances Withdrawal that is grainingly include a refund of applicable tuition burfill not include a refund of feeStudents on Financial Aid are encouraged speak with a representative from Financial Aid. Studenstresiding on campus are encouraged to speak with a UniversityHousing representative regarding their housing. Students with a meal plan are encouraged to speak with a Business Services representative.
- (5) Documentation Guidelinessertainingto Reasons for Exceptional Circumstances Withdrawals
 - (A) Physical Illness or Injury Withdrawals
 - (i) Documentation must be on the official letterhead of the treating licensed health care provideend dated
 - (ii) Documentation must explain or detail:
 - 1. Diagnosis of the condition.
 - 2. Reason the condition prevents successful completion of all course work.
 - 3. Dates of treatment.
 - 4. Prognosis
 - 5. Date the student will be able to assume fullacademic responsibilities.
 - (B) Mental Illness Withdrawals.

- (i) Documentation must be on the official letterhead of the treating licensedmentalhealth care providernd dated
- (ii) Documentation must explain or detail:
 - 1. Presence of a mental disorder classifiable under the current American Psychiatric Association's Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disordersuch disordermust be diagnosed and documented by an appropriately licensed mental health professionalStress and mild clinical depression are examples of conditiohat tdo not qualify for Exceptional Circumstances Withdrawal.

- (B) Complete and sign Release of Medical Information Form, if applicable.
- (C) Submit and attach personal letter explaining and justifying the reason for the request.
- (D) Submit and attach supporting documentation.
- (E) Return all forms and domentation to the AVP/Dean of Sudents Office two weeks prior to final exams.
- (F) The student will be notified of the decision in writing togail.
- (7) Students who are denied Extiepal Circumstance Withdrawal may appeal the decisionin writing to the Senior Vice President for Student Affairs, postmarked or received within ten (10) academic days of mailing of ECW decisletter. The Senior Vice President for Student Affairs may, within a reasonable timeframe, approve, modify, or reject the original decision be Senior Vice President for Student Affair's decision will be considered final agency action.
- (8) Submitted documents shall remain in the AVP area of Studest Office, ensuring confidentiality in accordance feamily Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) Guidelines.
- (9) When an Exceptional Circumstances Withdrawal is granted due to physical illness or injury or mental illness a Student Affairs registion hold may be placed on the student's record and the student maypoorhibited from enrolling forthe semesterfollowing the exceptional circumstance withdrawal. In order for the Student Affairs hold to be lifted, the student must submit documentation/fis or her treating licensed health care professional confirming that the student is medically and/or psychologicall fit to return to schoolThe documentation will be reviewed by the ECW committee hich will make a recommendation to the AVP and Dearof Studens or designee, as whether to continue the student prohibition of enrollment, reinstate the student with conditions, or reinstate the student with no conditions.
- (10) Nothing herein shall reduce the commitment of the University to accommodate the needs of students with disabilities who are able to participate in University functions without hazard to themselves or to others.
