## Regulation 4.006 Student Government and Student Organizations

- (1) PURPOSE.
  - (a) Student Organizations and Student Governmentate an essential part of the Florida Atlantic University community and are an integral part host total academic program. The presence of a diverse group of organizations is in the best interest of the University and itstudents. Such organizations foster valuable experiences fostudents that lead to ignificant learning and development and create a sense of belonging.
  - (b) StudentOrganizationsand Student Governmeptovide a valuable service to the University community by promoting leadership development, community spirit, activism, community service, and social and cultural interactiostudent Organizations and Student Governmentponsor conferences, seminars, lectures, debates, cultural and social events, and fine arts programs. These activities allow FAU Students to meet and interact with local, state, nationally insternationally renowned scholars, artists, politicians, acadeanis and other professionals. Student Organization and Student Governmentmembers spend countless volunteer hours each academic year participating in service projects for campus and community efforts.

- (a) Any Student(s) wanting to begin a new fudent Organizationshall file, within the first six weeks to the fall or spring semester, Statement of Intent to Organize form with the Office of Student Involvement & Leadership on the campus on which they wish toorganize
  - After submitting the completed form the Office of StudentInvolvement & Leadership ad receiving approval, the group may theold and advertise meetings on campus. This is considered provisional status.
  - 2. The provisional status granted forsix weeks during which time the group shall submit Official Petition for Registration
  - 3. Failure to submitan Official Petition for Registratiowithin the six week period of provisional statushall deactivate the tudent Organization At this point, the group will not be able to function astudent Organization and mayno longer be entitled to the Privileges afford to registered Student Organizations.
- (b) Official Petition for Registration. The fficial Petition for Registration shall be filed as soon as the membership of the organization is largely complete used occur within the six week peiod of provisional status The Official Petition for Registration shall include:

- (c) The Office of Student Involvement & Leadershippod/or the Dean of Studesnivill verify eligibility of the appointed and elected udent Officers of all registered Student Organization and Student Government
- (d) Students who do not meet the eligibility requirementss acutlined in this regulation will be deemed as disqualified to serve Stasdent Officers and be required to relinquish their office immediately upon notification (subject to appeal).
- (e) The privilege of representing the University carries with it the digation to set a high standard of behavior is, therefore, the responsibility of the University President to ensure that udent representatives do not continue to repretent University, when, due to their misconduct, such participation would one fleorly on the University Failure to comply with the provision of this section may result in disciplinary action being taken against Student pursuant to the Florida Atlantic University Regulation 4.007 Student Code of Conduct
- (f) To be eligibleto hold elected or appointed office Student Government carry Student Organizationa Student must meet University standards. These criteria are separate from and in addition to any criteria for office that a Student Organization or Student Governmentary set for itself, and emphasize the necessary balance that should exist between academic standards and commitment to s

- 8. Be free of any Student Code of Condustanction sunless an exemption is granted by the Dean of Students Office.
- 9. StudentOfficers must be degree seekingtudents, but not necessarily in a selected major.

Students interested in holding offices who have not completed a term and do not have a FAU cumulative grade point average must obtain permission from the Office oStudent Involvement and Leadership and/or the Dean of Students Office in order to be eligibilities transferring grade point average must meet thermulini qualifications to holdStudentOfficer position.

Students whodo nototherwise meethe requirements data 2955 ctto To UEMET B(ti)-lt( who have received approvator the Dean of Students have a reduced course load, or other wavier(s) of these standards to due disability that has been registereworth the Office of Students with Disabilities, are eligible to hold Student Officer positions in Student Government an Student Organizations as described herein.
- 12. Notwithstanding the other provisions of this section dents in their last semester before graduation are eligible to participate dent Officer activities if they are enrolled for the required number of credits needed for graduation that semester. This provision shall only apply for one term
- (g) Appeab. Appeals of non-eligibility decisions for StudentOfficers under this regulation must be submitted writing to the Deanof Students Officeon the appropriate campus on the SeniorVice President for Student Affairs ithin five (5) business alays of non-eligibility.
  - 1. The appeal must state the grounds for appealing the decision.
  - 2. A response to the tudent appeal will be given within five (5) usiness days of receipt of the appeal twhich time a hearing may be scheduled before the Eligi
