Congratulations to **Phi Sigma Sigma, Zeta Phi Beta, and Alpha Kappa Alpha** who had the highest grade point averages among the sororities. **Pi Lambda Phi, and Sigma Phi Epsilon** earned the highest grade point averages for the fraternities. **Phi Sigma Sigma** has the highest Greek GPA for the fall semester!

For your convenience, the grade report includes the following: Associate/New Member and Overall Chapter numbers, Chapter and New Member GPA's, Members with a 3.50 or higher GPA, and the number of members not included in the chapter GPA.

Setting Goals: All three councils need to support educational programs in an attempt to improve the scholastic achievement of individual chapters. It is apparent that some chapters need to work harder to improve their overall GPA. You should be especially concerned if any members earned below a 2.0. In addition, all new member classes must strive to achieve at least a 2.5 GPA, not a 2.0 GPA! Assisting members with their academic achievement is central to each chapter's mission!

Those chapter members that did not complete the term, attended a different college, or did not have any hours for an average were listed on the individual chapter grade report. These individuals' statistics were figured in your chapter's overall GPA. Additionally, you may find that some chapter members were not on the grade report. While we may have overlooked them, chances are they did not appear on your updated list. In either case, we would be more than happy to provide you with GPA's for any "missing persons" as we will be unable to run the computer program for grades again. You are unable to remove any members from your report; each chapter was responsible for removing members earlier in the semester.
